# Immediate Impact: Expanded Technical Capacity





# Feature Program: Pulm/Critical Care Division Directors Calls

• Held every Sunday night from 8:30 -10:00 pm for months, these calls included presentations, case studies and real-time discussions as the understanding of the disease and its sequelae became more apparent.

"Questions in the March and April discussion chats asking about visitor policies during the dying process, whether anyone could share a protocol for terminal extubation in comfort care cases that minimized aerosol exposure for their team, how different hospitals were handling the ethics associated with ventilator allocation, and how to care for a COVID patient with ARDS who was in her second trimester of pregnancy were inevitably met responses of with 'I have something I can send you'."

# Feature Program: Critical Care Training Forum

- The COVID-19 Critical Care Training Forum (CCTF) focuses on teaching critical care topics followed by an open discussion for early career professionals and non-ICU trained healthcare providers.
  - Case Based Learning with Panel Discussions
  - <u>Thirty-one events</u> have been held to date and all are available for free viewing on demand
- Objectives:
  - To help in the care of COVID-19 patients by training non-PCC physicians in the assessment and treatment of COVID-19/ viral pneumonia / ARDS.
  - To help medical practitioners feel less anxious and more confident in caring for COVID-19 patients during the pandemic.
  - To widely share best practices in the care of COVID-19 patients
- Target audience:
  - Non-PCC trained healthcare practitioners of all levels, students, house staff, attendings, physician assistants, nurses, NP, respiratory therapists, etc.



# Feature Program: Focus on African American and Latinx Communities

- Launched June 15th in the 50 hardest-hit COVID-19 zip codes in the US
  - Heavily populated by persons of color
  - Added Cherokee Nation zip codes
  - ForYourLungHealth.com webpage
    - o:30 second video YouTube and other social media platforms
    - Materials in English and Spanish
    - Links to disease-specific resources in asthma, COPD, PF and IPF, and other lung diseases
- Reached 2.6M video views and 4oK web visits in seven weeks
- Co-branded with CHEST
- Supported by an educational grant from GSK and donation from Boehringer Ingelheim Pharmaceuticals, Inc.



#### COVID-19 AND LUNG HEALTH In this time of COVID-19, it's especially important that everyone with a chronic lung disease such as asthma or COPD, protect their lung health.





# Feature Program: Clinical Trial Protocol Discussions

- The ATS convened experts in pulmonary and critical care from Assembly leadership and the VA Health System to provide timely feedback on COVID-19 clinical trial designs
  - Current and evolving understanding of the disease
  - Inclusion/Exclusion Criteria
  - Necessary changes in informed consent
  - Navigating which centers have capacity for trials and which are full
- Held approximately 25 different focus groups, usually within 48-72 hours of the request at no cost
- Good model for any clinical trial discussions moving forward

"My long-term career goal is to become an independent physician-scientist with expertise in using machine learning algorithms to discover precision medicine approaches to treating heterogeneous critical care syndromes such as sepsis. The multicenter data infrastructure that I build with this grant will have direct use in my future sepsis research. Similarly, the methodology I develop through this ATS grant will directly inform my research during my K23 to discover novel sepsis subphenotypes. " - Dr. Bhavani

My research, which focuses on the effect of the COVID19 pandemic on TB care, has allowed collaboration between our research team and six TB clinics across the country. This consortium will serve as a valuable network for ongoing research into TB in Uganda." - Dr. Jackson



# Feature Program: DocMatter Community

Pilot ATS DocMatter Community was launched in April 2020 to support knowledge transfer among members during early phases of COVID-19 pandemic.

Since then, ATS members have initiated discussions extending across a range of clinical topics, establishing the ATS DocMatter Community as a space for a critical cross-section of over 18,000 specialists to share observations, questions, emerging data and collective experience to drive better patient outcomes.


